

Bernard was ordained in July 1979 and joined the Diocese of St. George's

Granada in the Caribbean in 2006. In addition to preaching in parishes across the US each weekend, he also writes for internal and external communications of the organization. He is also currently an Adjunct Professor of Philosophy at Erie Community College as well as Adjunct Professor for the Communication and Leadership Program at Canisius College in the Not-For-Profit concentration.

ASIST Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training Wednesday, September 4-Thursday, September 5 Terra Sancta

ASIST is a two-day, two-trainer, workshop designed for members of all care-giving groups. Family, friends, and other community members may be the first to talk with a person at risk, but have little or no training. ASIST can also provide those in formal helping roles with professional development to ensure that they are prepared to provide suicide first aid help as part of the care they provide. The emphasis is on teaching suicide first-aid to help a person at risk stay safe and seek further help as needed. This workshop is free and includes lunch and snacks each day. It is a <u>one to one</u>, relationship-based mentoring program. All mentoring is done at the <u>school</u> during the school day.

Mentors and Mentees are matched based on their strengths.

A Mentor is an adult guide, an advocate and a <u>trusted friend</u>. They are not tutors or gift-givers, and cannot transport students.

Mentors are screened and receive training.

Mentors and Mentees meet <u>once a week for about 45 minutes during the school year.</u> The program was <u>founded</u> in 1991 by Head Football Coach Tom Osbourne, University of Nebraska, and his wife, Nancy.

The goal is for youth to graduate high school, pursue post-secondary education, establish a meaningful career and reach their full **potential**.

The impact of TEAMMATES Mentoring is profound!

Improved academic achievement, improved graduation rates, fewer disciplinary referrals, fewer unexcused absences. More than 95% of mentees say they are happy and feel important when they meet with their mentor and that they trust their mentor.

SAFETY AND SECURITY MINISTRY

In December 2017, our parish laid the foundation for a new and necessary ministry: Safety & Security. Sixteen members of our parish — staff and parishioners — attended a two-day conference on Church Safety and Security hosted by the Box Elder Police Department. The presentations were given by professional law enforcement officers working as consultants with Strategos International.

Following this initial and intensive training, our parish formed our Safety & Security Ministry that conducted an initial safety and security assessment of our parish grounds and buildings. In consultation with Catholic Mutual, our insurance provider, the team developed our parish approach and priorities to safety and security. Our Safety & Security Team is blessed to have retired and active duty law enforcement personnel, paramedics, and medical professionals working together for the benefit of our parish family.

Many improvements to our safety and security have been made at the Cathedral parish over these last two years. These developments include: the installation of video surveillance cameras in our buildings and around our campus; a new drop safe for parish collections; improved money handling procedures to increase accountability and transparency; professional security monitoring by Knight Security; trained parish Safety & Security ministers; and first aid and medical supplies stocked in our church and parish facilities.

Improving our safety and security, in and around our parish campus, remains a high priority for our parish leadership. Our parish Safety & Security Team regularly plans for our safety in case of various threats such as incidences of severe weather, medical emergencies, theft, burglary, threats of physical violence, disruptions to our liturgical celebrations, faith formation sessions, or communal gatherings. Various contingencies are being considered and appropriate prevention, deterrence, and responses are being considered, developed, and implemented.
