



Deacon James Keating is a deacon of the Archdiocese of Omaha, where he serves as Director of the Office of the Diaconate. He is married and a father of four. He was ordained to the diaconate in 2001. Dr. Keating is an award-winning author and Director of Theological Formation in the Institute for Priestly Formation (IPF) at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. In 1993, he was appointed by the Papal Nuncio to be Associate Professor of Moral and Spiritual Theology at the Pontifical College Josephinum, Columbus, Ohio. He served in this capacity for 13 years until 2006 when he joined the IPF at Creighton.
