### DECEMBER 29, 2019-THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH



The Christian family is a school of prayer. Within our families — from our parents who live and share the Catholic faith — we have our first encounters with God. Saint John Paul the Great wrote: "Family prayer has its own characteristic qualities. It is prayer offered in common, husband and wife together, parents and children together...by reason of their dignity and mission, Christian parents have the specific responsibility of educating their children in prayer, introducing them to gradual discovery of the mystery of God and to personal dialogue with Him..." (Familiaris Consortio, 59-60).

In the family we learn to be thankful for God's blessings, as we pray before meals: Bless us o Lord and these thy gifts.... We learn to rely upon God's divine protection in the Guardian Angel Prayer: Angel of God, My Guardian Dear, to whom His love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and to guard, to rule and guide.

In the family, we learn to honor Mary and turn to her with trust and confidence: *Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus....* 

We discover our true identity as beloved sons and daughters of our heavenly Father, as from youngest to oldest we pray: *Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name....* 

The Holy Family of Nazareth is the prototype and example for all Christian families: St. Joseph was a "just man", may he always guard, protect and enlighten families. May the Virgin Mary, who is the Mother of the Church, also be the Mother of "the Church of the home." May Christ the Lord, the Universal King, the King of Families, be present in every Christian home bestowing light, joy, serenity, and strength.

Terra Sancta Retreat Center


