Saint Paul leads us in praising God: “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with **every spiritual blessing in the heavens**... In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ...”

This is some very powerful praise! Saint Paul recognizes the many blessings that we have received from the hand of God. What are these “**spiritual blessings**” which have been given to us?

Through Jesus Christ, God has given us a share in divine life. He has opened for us the way to holiness — **intimate communion with God** — and the promise of eternal life! Today, right now, we already participate in the goodness of God through adoption. God, the all-powerful Creator of all things, has chosen us to be His adopted sons and daughters! We belong to the household of God—we belong to the family of God!

We have received these spiritual blessings through the life of the Church. We have received them **through our encounters with God** through Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Communion, and Reconciliation. Over and over again, God pours out his blessings upon us through the sacramental life of the Church.

In the Sacraments we come **face to face with Jesus**. It is Jesus who baptizes us; by His power, we are plunged into the divine life of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is Jesus who confirms us in His Holy Spirit and feeds us with His Body and Blood in Holy Communion. It is Jesus who extends His mercy to us in the confessional and forgives our sins.

All of this — **the whole sacramental life** — makes us and keeps us united to God as His beloved sons and daughters, brothers and sisters in Christ. We are blessed — by God's goodness and generosity — to share in the fullness of life through Jesus Christ!

This is the Good News — the Gospel — that we are blessed to live and that we are privileged to share. As Jesus sent out His disciples in the Gospel, so He sends us out today. He sends us out into the world — into our homes, places of employment, our community, our schools — to share the Good News. **God desires all to be saved** and come to a knowledge of the truth: we are called to share in the fullness of divine life — to be blessed with every spiritual blessing in the heavens!

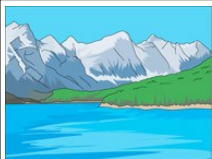

Additionally, our parish financial reports are submitted to the Diocesan Finance Office for monthly review. Our parish financial reports are published in the Bulletin on a quarterly basis and these reports are available to our parishioners upon request. Last month, an independent audit was performed by a Certified Public Accountant to assess our compliance with Diocesan policies and standard business practices. The Cathedral parish consistently seeks to be good stewards, prudent and transparent in the use of our financial resources.
