Pope Francis, in his most recent apostolic exhortation, Guadete et Exsultate: On the Call to Holiness in Today's World says: "The Lord asks everything of us, and in return he offers us true life, the happiness for which we were created. He wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence."

"The Lord asks everything of us...." At first glance, this might sound terribly unreasonable and even impossible. How can He ask everything of me? There are many demands on my time and energy, on my finances. I have to provide for myself and my family. I have obligations at work and in my community. How is it possible to give everything to God?

In these months of summer, as we seek to understand how God could ask everything of us, maybe we can look to baseball and softball for some guidance. The whole team has one main and overarching focus: win the game! To win the game, your team must score more runs than the other team. Each member of your team seeks to do everything to keep the other team from scoring and to help your team to score as many runs as possible.

During the game — and even in preparation for the game everything I do as a player is aimed at victory. How I warmup, how I bat, how I run, and how I position myself in the field. I keep my attention on every play, every situation, and I anticipate the next move. Everything I do is focused upon winning the game. My coach and my teammates are asking everything of me—asking for my very best.

So it is in our daily lives. Whatever we do, we do with the aim of serving God. Our aim — each and every day — is eternal life with God. We are called to become saints! (Only saints are in heaven... and heaven is what we have been Therefore, our work, our schooling, our created for!). recreation, our eating, sleeping... every activity has communion with God as its overall aim and goal.

God asks everything of us. This means that God is a part of all I do. I never forget — I remain attentive — throughout each day and during every activity that what I am doing, saying, or thinking is aimed towards the loving service of God.

When we offer God everything, Pope Francis tells us that God, in return, "offers us true life, the happiness for which we were created." This is our aim: eternal life, communion with God, heaven!

God "wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence." Let us offer Him everything!
