PRAY FOR YOUR DECEASED

LOVED ONES—On All Soul's Day and through the month of November we pray for those who have died in these ways:

- 1. Attend Mass All Soul's Day, November 2.** Names of loved ones whose funeral was celebrated at Cathedral are read.
- 2. Have a Mass prayed for your loved one.** Speak with Janet at the rectory office, 342-0507.
- 3. Make a page for The Books of the Dead.** Books are rotated by the main altar, the altar in Our Lady's Chapel, the altars of St. Joseph and St. Patrick, and the main entry during November. Deceased loved ones whose names are in the Book of the Dead are remembered at every Mass at Cathedral during November. Pick up blank pages at the north and south altars. Sample pages are there as well. **Put the last name of your loved one at the top of your page so your page can be placed alphabetically in the Books.** When you return your page to the north and south altar or to the rectory office, it will be placed in a plastic sleeve and into the Books.
- 4. Pray for an indulgence (forgiveness of sins) on behalf of your loved one.** The handout, "Praying for Our Beloved Dead" on the tables at the entrances and in the rack at the south door explains.
