

CROSS CATHOLIC OUTREACH



Rev. Bernard Olszewski, JCD will be visiting our parish next weekend to speak at all the Masses on behalf of Cross Catholic Outreach which was founded to create a meaningful link between parishes in America and the priests and nuns working in the Church overseas in the Caribbean, Africa, Asia, Central and South America.



Fr. Bernard was born and raised in Trenton, NJ. He entered the community of the Conventual Franciscan Friars and studied in Ellicott City, MD and at St. Hyacinth College and Seminary in Granby, MA earning a BA in philosophy. He receive a MA in Sacred Theology at the Pontifical Faculty of St. Bonaventure and a Doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical Gregorian University. Fr. Bernard was ordained in July 1979 and joined the Diocese of St. George's Granada in the Caribbean in 2006.

In addition to preaching in parishes across the US each weekend, he also writes for internal and external communications of the organization. He is also currently an Adjunct Professor of Philosophy at Erie Community College as well as Adjunct Professor for the Communication and Leadership Program at CanisiusCollege in the Not-For-Profit concentration.

SUICIDE INTERVENTION

ASIST Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training Wednesday, September 4-Thursday, September 5 Terra Sancta

ASIST is a two-day, two-trainer, workshop designed for members of all care-giving groups. Family, friends, and other community members may be the first to talk with a person at risk, but have little or no training. ASIST can also provide those in formal helping roles with professional development to ensure that they are prepared to provide suicide first aid help as part of the care they provide. The emphasis is on teaching suicide first-aid to help a person at risk stay safe and seek further help as needed. This workshop is free and includes lunch and snacks each day. However, free-will offerings will help offset the costs of lunch, snacks and materials provided. All are welcome. Donations are appreciated, but in no way expected.


