

FEBRUARY UPDATE: HOPE FOR NEW LIFE (HFNL) JAIL MINISTRY Volunteers Needed

Our Jail Ministry is entering it's 14th year of service! What a blessing for the inmates we serve in the Pennington County Jail and for those of us who are a part of this spiritual outreach mission. Our team currently includes six dedicated lay ministers, two of whom visit the jail every Wednesday on a rotating basis, and over 50 associated prayer partners. If you are thinking about a way to serve Our Lord and share your faith, perhaps you might consider joining us. In the HFNL Jail Ministry, we have found our service to be deeply rewarding and a spiritual enhancement to our faith. As you prayerfully reflect on the possibility of joining us, we offer this thought from the early 20th Century Evangelist Oswald Chambers: "Service is the overflow of super abounding devotion and is the echo of my identification with the nature of God. To serve God is the deliberate love gift of a nature that has heard the call of God. Service is expressive of that which is fitted to my nature, while God's call is expressive of His nature and the two work together." [My Utmost for His for His Highest]. 



DEACON JAMES KEATING, PH.D. DIRECTOR OF THEOLOGICAL FORMATION

INSTITUTE FOR PRIESTLY FORMATION, OMAHA, NE

Deacon James Keating is a deacon of the Archdiocese of Omaha, where he serves as Director of the Office of the Diaconate. He is married and a father of four. He was ordained to the diaconate in 2001. Dr. Keating is an award-winning author and Director of Theological Formation in the Institute for Priestly Formation (IPF) at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. In 1993, he was appointed by the Papal Nuncio to be Associate Professor of Moral and Spiritual Theology at the Pontifical College Josephinum, Columbus, Ohio. He served in this capacity for 13 years until 2006 when he joined the IPF at Creighton. Dr. Keating has delivered over 700 workshops and lectures internationally, authored over 100 essays and 12 books, including co-authoring "The Way of Mystery: Eucharist and Moral Living."


