OPEN WIDE THE DOORS TO CHRIST!

The Acts of the Apostles follows the development of the early Church. In the months and years following the death and resurrection of Jesus and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we see how the first disciples **actively and intentionally share** the joy of the Gospel. Their lives are deeply rooted in the life of the risen Christ.

Our forebearers in the faith “devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers.... They ate their meals with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people. And every day **the Lord added to their number** those who were being saved” (Acts 2: 42-46).

Discipleship involves more than our own personal adherence to our faith in Jesus Christ. Discipleship includes **sharing the Good News** with others. Authentic discipleship means that we are missionaries in our daily lives: we willingly and enthusiastically share the Gospel with others by our deeds and our words. We are called and commanded, by Jesus Himself, to be **missionary disciples**: “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit: (Matthew 28:19).

In today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we learn of the **missionary discipleship** of Paul and Barnabas who “proclaimed the good news... and made a considerable number of disciples” in the places they visited. They also encouraged the other Christian believers: “They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, ‘It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God.’” (Acts 14:21-25).

Seeing other people brought to **salvation in Jesus Christ** — accepting the Gospel and being baptized — brings joy to all of us. Are we not moved by the baptism of a child or the entrance into full communion with the Church by those at the Easter Vigil? Sharing the Gospel and participating in the conversion of another — a family member, friend, or coworker — is a great joy. The dawn of new life in Christ and the promise of eternal life that shines on them is so beautiful and a cause for our joy!

Paul and Barnabas share this joy of conversion with their fellow parishioners. When these two **missionary disciples** returned home, “they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had **opened the door of faith** to the Gentiles” (Acts 14: 26-27).

In this Easter season, moved by the new life that is ours in Christ Jesus, the Holy Spirit desires to give us greater courage to be **true missionary disciples**. Sharing the joy of the Gospel — sharing the love, mercy, and goodness of God revealed in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and our participation in this life through the Church — is our call and our joy! As missionary disciples, let us open wide the doors of our hearts and our parish to others! **Who will know the joy of the Gospel through you this week?**

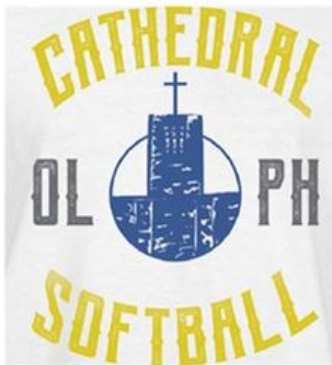

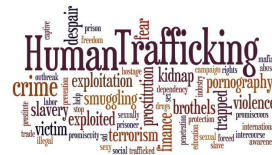

HOLY LAND RELIGIOUS ARTICLES May 25-26

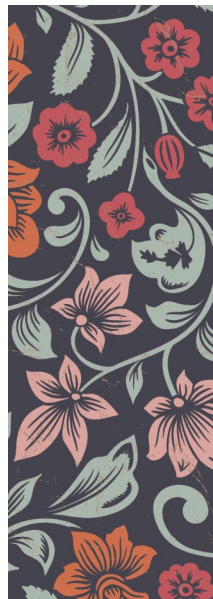
