Our Lady of Perpetual Help Cathedral was dedicated on May 7, 1963. Our beautiful church, hall, and rectory were designed and built *prior* to the completion of the Second Vatican Council which came to a close on December 8, 1965.

Parish life prior to the Second Vatican Council was something different than parish life today. Several priests were able to oversee the catechetical, spiritual, and sacramental needs of the parish family. Few staff members were necessary and the rectory was primarily used as a residence for our priests. Today, our community expectations in the areas of faith formation, youth ministry, outreach, homebound and hospital ministry, and parish administration have multiplied. We have both greater numbers of parishioners and greater demands for parish services for our children, families, and others.

As envisioned by the Second Vatican Council, we see a greater involvement of the laity in the life of the parish. The Church is calling for laity to be active both within the parish walls and beyond as intentional and missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. We have witnessed, in these 55 years since the dedication of the Cathedral, a dramatic increase in the number of ministries, councils, committees, and apostolates which are undertaken by the laity.

Over the years, our parish buildings have been used in creative ways to accommodate our new ministries and functions: used in ways never originally intended. During times of faith formation, we are forced to use the lower sacristy, the back of the church, and the rectory living room and dining room for classrooms. There were even times, over the years, when we used the choir loft as a classroom! To accommodate a growing parish support staff, we have encroached upon the priests' residence. Additionally, areas in the basement of the rectory — originally designed for storage — have become offices for our staff members and for meeting rooms.

Our parish hall — basement — has served us well. We have many good memories of the events, receptions, and celebrations down there. Yet, as nice as it is, a basement is not easily accessible for many, readily visible, and particularly inviting.

Today, as a community of faith, we are looking to the future of our parish life. How can we accommodate all of our lively and engaging ministries? How can we invite parishioners and newcomers more effectively and warmly into our parish family? How can we provide for the many ministries, services, and support staff that our parish family expects and enjoys?

Our parish family — for several generations — has been developing new pastoral practices for this new era in the history of the Church. Now, we have come to the time when we need the facilities to accomplish the ministry and build the communal life that we have developed... and will continue to develop into the future! Come Holy Spirit!

Parish Budget 2018-2019

On Monday, June 18, the Finance Council and the Pastoral Council reviewed and passed a balanced parish budget for the coming fiscal year 2018-2019. The budget year begins on July 1, 2018 and runs through June 30, 2019.

The budget process begins each year in April and passes through several reviews, amendments, and modifications by the Finance Council. It goes through final review in June and takes effect on July 1.

This year's budget estimates that we will have \$1,662,451 in projected income from our financial stewardship and other donations. Our parish expenses for the coming year are estimated to be \$1,662,451. Parish expenses include all of the costs for our pastoral programs, faith formation, liturgies, music, sacraments, evangelization, outreach to the poor and needy, community life, our priests, salaries and benefits for our staff, and building maintenance and upkeep.

Thank you for your continued sacrifice for the building up of God's kingdom by your intentional generous financial stewardship.
